







Five Values

1. Adequate

i. Funding should be adequate to allow all students to achieve state standards

2. Equitable

- i. Horizontal equity: All students receive relatively equitable funding
- ii. Targeted/Vertical equity: Students receive equitable funding based on their needs
- iii. This is done by targeting funding to high-need students (For example: At-risk, MII, Special Ed. & low-income)

3. Flexible with guardrails

i. Including investments in teachers and other staff

4. Transparency

- i. Including streamlining the formula to reduce the administrative burden on schools
- ii. Clarity on how funds are generated and expended

5. Connecting student outcomes to funding



Three-Tiered Hybrid Model (State Funds Only)

CONCENTRATION FUNDING:

PER PUPIL flexible allocation of funds to support school operations and allow for LEA flexibility

SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING: PER PUPIL flexible allocation based on number of low income and ML students. Other needs, such as homeless, foster can be added

BASE FUNDING: Staffing required to open a school/LEA. Weighted to maintain student/teacher ratios based on grade level and special education status. Includes teachers, instructional support positions, principals, administrative/clerical support etc.
